Darius the Great died while the war with the Greeks was still going on. The struggle was followed strongly but uselessly by his successors, Xerxes I and Artaxerxes. By 479 BC the Persians had been driven from all of the Greece. Although they regained control of the Ionian Islands and continued to be a major power in Asia, their attempt to extend their dominion into Europe had come to an end. The last century and half of the Achaemenid Empire's existence was full of assassinations, revolts of provincial governors, and barbarian attacks, until finally in 330 BC its independent was **annihilated** by the armies of Alexander the Great".
